A Note from Abbé Stancliffe

Dear Faithful,

My name is Abbé Matthew Stancliffe. I was born February 4, 1999 in Miami, Florida. I am the fourth of eight children, five girls and three boys. I felt an attraction to the priesthood from a very young age. I thought seriously of a vocation for the first time at the age of seven. My family was very blessed to know several holy priests during my earliest childhood years who undoubtedly contributed to my later discernment. My family moved a good deal during my childhood living in Florida, Georgia, Alabama and South Carolina successively. In 2012, we left the southeast and moved to the Kansas City area in Missouri. While we had always tried to attend the most reverent and beautiful Mass wherever we were, we did not discover the Traditional Latin Mass until 2015 at the Institute's apostolate of Old Saint Patrick's Oratory in Kansas City. After going to Mass there for two Sundays, we became parishioners and my younger brother and I began to learn how to serve the Latin Mass.

I grew to love the traditional liturgy very quickly and began to learn more about the Institute. During my senior year of high school in 2017, I made a vocational visit to the Provincial Headquarters in Chicago and then applied for admission into the pre-seminary formation program. I completed one year of candidacy at Saint Mary's Oratory in Wausau, Wisconsin and a second year at Kloster Maria Engelport in Germany. During these two years, I participated in the community life of the Institute canons and oblates with daily Mass, chanting the Divine Office, work in the house and sacristy and learning French. In September of 2019, I entered Gricigliano, the Institute's seminary in Tuscany, Italy just outside of Florence. In the summer of 2020, I received the cassock and tonsure. During my next three years at seminary, I consecutively received the orders of Porter and Lector, Exorcist and Acolyte. On July 3, 2024, I was ordained subdeacon by His Excellency Bishop Glen Provost. I am very happy to have been sent by my superiors to spend this year at Immaculate Heart of Mary Oratory in San Jose. I greatly look forward to meeting all of you and I humbly ask for your prayers as I continue my formation for the priesthood. May God bless you abundantly!

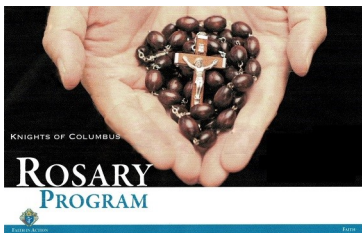
