



SERMON FOR PALM SUNDAY

Today Holy Mother Church celebrates one of her most jubilant Masses of the year. The mysterious blessing of Palms punctuates the beginning of the liturgy. This initiating component is followed immediately by a great procession with all of the faithful holding their palm branches in commemoration of Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem just before his Passion. Dom Gueranger remarks that, it is not death, it is triumph, that Jesus is to receive today in Jerusalem. The Messias, before being nailed to the cross, is to be proclaimed king by the people of the great city; the little children are to make her streets echo with their Hosannas to the son of David... This, my dear Faithful is what we are to contemplate today.

Therefore, take joy in the celebration that Holy Mother Church lays before us this morning. However, let us not simply stop here, but rather continue with Our Lord on his journey this week. Let us continue with him to the Last Supper with his disciples...Let us wait with him in the Garden of Gethsemane...Let us accompany him with compassion to his crucifixion on Golgotha...Let us keep vigil with him in the tenebrae, in the darkness of the mysteries surrounding the Triduum...Let us abide with Him until his triumphal Resurrection is signaled by the first peal of bells, ringing in the Easter Season.

Our age is quite comfortable with the triumphal Jesus, the Jesus receiving pomp and respect as on Palm Sunday and as on Easter Sunday. We love the risen Jesus! However, we are far less comfortable with the important work carried out by our Lord between these two triumphal events...work essential to the Salvation of mankind. We are uncomfortable with the neglected Jesus, the beaten and bloodied Jesus, the lifeless body of Jesus hanging from the cross after many hours of agony. Was Jesus any less God and any less Savior when he was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane? Was He any less God when the soldiers whipped him through the streets of Jerusalem? Was he any less deserving of Glory and Honor as the soldiers were hoisting him up on the Cross to finish their evil deed? The Same Jesus who triumphantly entered into Jerusalem with palms strewn at this feet and miraculously raised from the dead Easter Morning is the same Jesus who was beaten, unjustly imprisoned and killed. What kind of friends are we if we only accompany his person for the triumphant parts of his life? Should we do this, are we no better than fair weather friends?

The holiest week of the Christian calendar is now upon us. Though Holy Mother Church does not strictly bind us to wholly participate in the liturgies commemorating the pains borne by Our Lord for our Salvation during Holy Week, it behooves us as friends of Christ to accompany him on this journey.

When Christendom still existed no one did any commerce during all of Holy Week. Businesses were closed. Even the civil courts did no proceedings during these days so that the Faithful could closely follow their Beloved on his journey. We no longer live in those times and many of us are obliged to work these days. However, let us not have this be an excuse for ignoring the liturgies of our Lord's Passion until next Sunday. Certainly, many excuses will be found in the coming week to do all sorts of unessential tasks that have little or nothing at all to with the commemoration of Our Savior's sorrowful Passion. If we can find time for these, then we must find time to abide with Our Lord.

Even now, many Catholic souls have gone through the season of Lent, now almost fully spent without having performed a substantial penance, or who dropped their resolutions only in the first or second weeks. Guilt and regret will fill their hearts.

All is not lost though. Might it be proposed for all of those finding themselves in this situation to make a concerted effort to attend all of the Triduum liturgies? They could attend the Tenebrae on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evenings. Additionally, they could attend the Holy Thursday Mass, the Mass of the Presanctified on Friday, the Holy Saturday Vigil and then Easter Sunday Mass? Is this a big ask? Yes, it is. However, no works of ours on Earth can fully measure up to the value of that which Christ's Passion purchased. It will be a sacrifice, certainly to faithfully attend all of those prayers of the Church. Lent bids us sacrifice, for the forgiveness of Our sins and for love of God. Even if we have done little or nothing up to this point to live the penance of the season, there is a way to make this final week meaningful...and to receive a greater reward of joy come Easter morning. You will certainly not regret making such a choice to accompany Your Saviour during the next few days.

May Jesus bless you with a prayerful Holy Week and a greater love for Him as a fruit of your efforts.


3 ON 3 BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT
