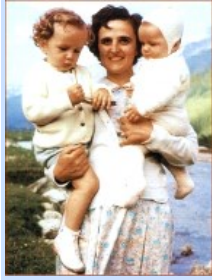

### June 24 - Nativity of St. John the Baptist

Excerpt from *The Liturgical Year* by Dom Gueranger

*The Voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare ye the way of the Lord; behold thy God! [Isa. xl 3, 9] In this world grown now so cold, who can understand earth's transports at hearing these glad tidings so long expected? The promised God was not yet manifested; but already had the heavens bowed down [Ps. xvii 10] to make way for His passage. No longer was He 'the One Who is to come,' He for Whom our fathers, the illustrious Saints of the prophetic age, ceaselessly called in their indomitable hope. Still hidden, indeed, but already in our midst, [...]*

*Such is the order decreed from on high, in the manifestation of the Messias. Conformably to the ways of men, the God-Man would not intrude Himself into public life; He would await, for the inauguration of His Divine ministry, some man who, having preceded Him in a similar career, would be hereby sufficiently accredited to introduce Him to the people. Sublime part for a creature to play, to stand guarantee for his God, witness for the Word! The exalted dignity of him who was to fill such a position had been notified, as had that of the Messias, long before his birth. In the solemn liturgy of the age of types, the Levite choir, reminding the Most High of the meekness of David and of the promise made to him of a glorious heir, hailed from afar the mysterious lamp prepared by God for his Christ.*



### 3rd Sunday after Pentecost

**Introit** *Ps. 24:16, 18.* Look toward me, and have pity on me, O Lord, for I am alone and afflicted. Put an end to my affliction and my suffering, and take away all my sins, O my God. *Ps 24:1-2* To Thee, I lift up my soul, O Lord. In Thee, O my God, I trust; let me not be put to shame. Glory be... Look toward me...

**Collect** O God, protector of all who hope in Thee, without Whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy, increase Thy mercy toward us, that, with Thy guidance and direction we may so pass through the things of this temporal life as not to lose those of life eternal. Through Jesus Christ...

**Epistle** *1 Pet 5:6-11.* Beloved: Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in the time of visitation; cast all your anxiety upon Him, because He cares for you. Be sober, be watchful! For your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, goes about seeking someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same suffering befalls your brethren all over the world. But the God of all grace, Who has called us unto His eternal glory in Christ Jesus, will Himself, after we have suffered a little while, perfect, strengthen and establish us. To Him is the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

**Gradual** *Ps. 54:23, 17, 19.* Cast your care upon the Lord, and He will support you. *V.* When I called upon the Lord, He heard my voice from those who war against me. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 7:12.* A just judge is God, strong and patient; is He angry every day? Alleluia.

**Gospel** *Luke 15:1-10.* At that time, the publicans and sinners were drawing near to Him to listen to Him. And the Pharisees and the Scribes murmured, saying, This man welcomes sinners and eats with them. But He spoke to them this parable, saying, What man of you having a hundred sheep, and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the desert, and go after that which is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it upon his shoulders rejoicing. And on coming home he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, because I have found my sheep that was lost.' I say to you that, even so, there will be joy in heaven over one sinner who repents, more than over ninety-nine just who have no need of repentance. Or what woman, having ten drachmas, if she loses one drachma, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it? And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the drachma that I had lost.' Even so, I say to you, there will be joy among the angels of God over one sinner who repents.

**Offertory** *Ps. 9:11-13.* They trust in Thee who cherish Thy Name, O Lord, for Thou forsake not those who seek Thee. Sing praise to the Lord enthroned in Sion, for He has not forgotten the cry of the afflicted.

**Secret** Look favorably, O Lord, upon the offerings of Thy prayerful Church and grant that those who believe may, in continual holiness, partake of the them for their salvation. Through Jesus Christ...

**Communion** *Luke 15:10.* I say to you: there is joy among the angels of God over one sinner who repents.

**Post Communion** May the holy things of which we have partaken bring us to life and prepare for Thy everlasting mercy those whom Thou hast cleansed from sin. Through Jesus Christ...
