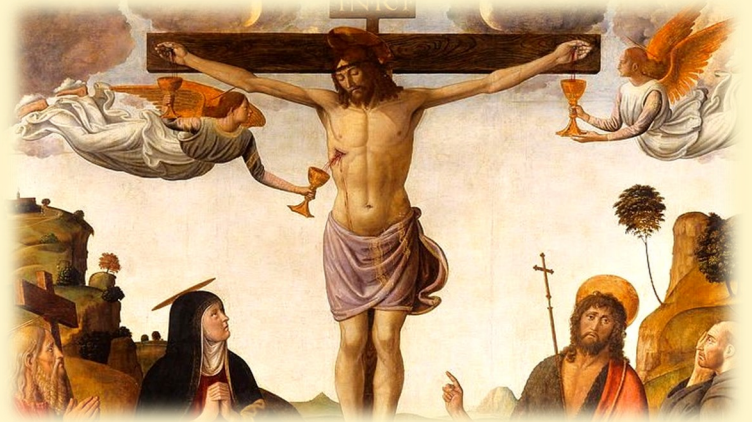

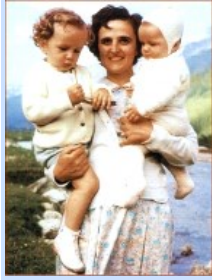

Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

We must not only leave alone what is not our business, but even be detached from our own will that we so often favor as if it were our own mother! God is not satisfied with our gifts if they are not accompanied by a generous disposition of our heart. Because of this, the Divine Majesty first of all demands our hearts...and then as a consequence all our gifts will be accepted. (Sermons 16 O. IX.)

Consecration to the Infant Jesus for the 25th day of each month

Sweetest Child Jesus, under the protection of the Immaculate Virgin, Thy Mother, and of Saint Joseph, today I prostrate myself at Thy feet and to Thee, Jesus, Who in Thy Nativity are given entirely to me, I consecrate my heart, my soul, my whole self in order to love Thee and serve Thee with all my strength. My Divine Savior, I would want to have a larger heart in order to love Thee more. Oh, if I could inspire in the hearts of everyone an ardent love of Thy adorable Infancy! O Holy Child Jesus, grant that all may know the omnipotence of Thy littleness and humility. Instill Thy simplicity and innocence in their hearts, and with all those who love Thee, O Divine Infant Jesus, today I adore in particular the moment of Thy Incarnation. Amen. *O Divine Infant King, have mercy on us and grant our petitions.*

Abundance of our Redemption by Saint Francis de Sales

God clearly foresaw that the first man would abuse his liberty, and that forsaking grace he would lose glory, but He did not wish to treat human nature so rigorously as He decreed to treat the angelic.

The devil had taken us away from our natural Lord, and though he had no title to us, yet our Lord redeemed us, redeemed what was His own, to make us more His own, if more His own we could be. St. Paul says: "You are bought with a great price." What is this price? *He redeemed us with the blood of the Lamb;* He pardoned not His own Son, but delivered Him to death for us.

That the sweetness of His mercy might be adorned by the beauty of His justice, He resolved to save man by means of a rigorous redemption, which no one being able to make except His own Son, He appointed that He should redeem men, not merely by one of His loving actions, which would have been more than sufficient to redeem a thousand millions of worlds, but by all the innumerable loving actions and dolorous sufferings He would perform and endure even to death, and the death of the cross, to which He destined Him, wishing that thus He should become the companion of our miseries in order to make us the companions of His glory hereafter, showing in this manner the riches of His goodness by a redemption, copious, abundant, magnificent, and excessive, which acquired, and, as it were, reconquered for us all the means necessary to attain to glory; so that no person can ever complain as if the divine mercy were wanting to him.

The least drop of Our Lord's blood was of infinitely more value than we, and nevertheless, to make us more His own, He wished to shed it all.



Fourth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ps. 26: 1,2,3* The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom shall I fear? The Lord is the protector of my life: of whom shall I be afraid? Mine enemies that trouble me have themselves been weakened and have fallen. (Ps) If armies in camp should stand to ether against me, my heart shall not fear. Glory be. The Lord is my light...

COLLECT: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the world may be regulated in its course by Thy governance for our peace, and that thy Church may with tranquil devotion rejoice. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *Rom. 8: 18-23* Brethren: I reckon that the sufferings of this time are not worthy to be compared with the glory to come, that shall be revealed in us. For the expectation of the creature waiteth for the revelation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him that made it subject in hope; because the creature also itself shall be delivered from the servitude of corruption, into the liberty of the glory of the children of God. For we know that every creature groaneth, and travaileth in pain, even till now; and not only it, but ourselves also, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption of the sons of God, the redemption of our body, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 78: 9, 10* Forgive us our sins, O Lord, lest the Gentiles should at anytime say: Where is their God? Help us, O God, our Savior; and for the honor of Thy name, O Lord, deliver us.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 9: 5, 10* Alleluia, alleluia. O God, Who sittest upon the throne, and judgest justice, be Thou the refuge of the poor in tribulation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Lk. 5: 1-11* At that time, when the multitude pressed upon Jesus to hear the word of God, He stood by the lake of Genesareth. And He saw two ships standing by the lake; but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets. And going up into one of the ships that was Simon's, He desired him to draw back a little from the land: and sitting He taught the multitudes out of the ship. Now when He had ceased to speak, He said to Simon: Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon, answering, said to Him: Master, we have labored all the night, and have taken nothing, but at Thy word I will let down the net. And when they had done this, they enclosed a very great multitude of fishes; and their net broke: and they beckoned to their partners that were in the other ship, that they should come and help them; and they came, and filled both the ships, so that they were almost sinking. Which when Simon Peter saw, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying: Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord. For he was wholly astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of fishes which they had taken: and so were also James and John the sons of Zebedee who were Simon's partners. And Jesus saith to Simon: Fear not, from henceforth thou shalt catch men. And having brought their ships to land, leaving all things they followed Him.

OFFERTORY: *Ps. 12: 4, 5* Enlighten mine eyes, that I never sleep in death, lest at any time mine enemy say: I have prevailed against him.

SECRET: Accept our oblations, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and be appeased by them: and mercifully compel even our rebel wills to turn to Thee. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: *Ps. 17: 3* The Lord is my firmament, and my refuge, and my deliverer; my God is my helper.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the mysteries which we have received, we beseech Thee, O Lord, purify us, and fulfill their purpose by defending us. Through our Lord...



Feast of the Most Precious Blood

INTROIT: *Apoc 5:9-10* Thou hast redeemed us, O Lord, with Thy Blood, out of every tribe and tongue and people and nation, and have made us for our God a kingdom. *Ps 88:2* The favors of the Lord I will sing forever; through all generations my mouth shall proclaim Thy faithfulness. Glory be... Thou have redeemed us, O Lord...

COLLECT: Almighty, eternal God, Who made Thine only-begotten Son the Redeemer of the world, and willed to be reconciled by His Blood, grant us, we beseech Thee, so to worship in this sacred rite the price of our salvation, and to be so protected by Its power against the evils of the present life on earth, that we may enjoy Its everlasting fruit in heaven. Through the same our Lord...

EPISTLE: *Heb 9:11-15* Brethren: When Christ appeared as High Priest of the good things to come, He entered once for all through the greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made by hands that is, not of this creation, nor again by virtue of blood of goats and calves, but by virtue of His own blood, into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkled ashes of a heifer sanctify the unclean unto the cleansing of the flesh, how much more will the blood of Christ, Who through the Holy Spirit offered Himself unblemished unto God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? And this is why He is mediator of a new covenant, that whereas a death has taken place for redemption from the transgressions committed under the former covenant, they who have been called may receive eternal inheritance according to the promise, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL: *1 John 5:6-8* This is He Who came in water and in blood, Jesus Christ; not in the water only, but in the water and in the blood. *V.* There are three that bear witness in heaven: the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one. And there are three that bear witness on earth: the Spirit, the water, and the blood; and these three are one.

ALLELUIA, alleluia. *V. 1 John 5:9* If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *John 19:30-35*

At that time, when Jesus had taken the wine, He said, It is consummated! And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit. The Jews therefore, since it was the Preparation Day, in order that the bodies might not remain upon the cross on the Sabbath for that Sabbath was a solemn day, besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other, who had been crucified with Him. But when they came to Jesus, and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs; but one of the soldiers opened His side with a lance, and immediately there came out Blood and water. And he who saw it has borne witness, and his witness is true.

OFFERTORY: *1 Cor. 10:16* The Cup of blessing that we bless, is it not the sharing of the Blood of Christ? And the Bread that we break, is it not the partaking of the Body of the Lord?

SECRET: Through this divine rite, we beseech Thee, may we draw near to Jesus, the mediator of the new covenant, and renew upon Thine altar, O Lord of hosts, the sprinkling of blood more eloquent than that of Abel. Through the same our Lord...

PREFACE OF THE HOLY CROSS: It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God; Who didst establish the salvation of mankind on the tree of the Cross; that whence death came, thence also life might arise again, and that he, who overcame by the tree, by the tree also might be overcome: Through Christ our Lord. Through whom the Angels praise Thy Majesty, the Dominions worship it, the Powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the heavenly hosts together with the blessed Seraphim in triumphant chorus unite to celebrate it. Together with these we entreat Thee that Thou mayest bid our voices also to be admitted while we say with lowly praise: Holy, Holy, Holy...

COMMUNION: *Heb 9:28* Christ was offered once to take away the sins of many; the second time with no part in sin He will appear unto the salvation of those who await Him.

POSTCOMMUNION: Admitted to the sacred banquet, O Lord, we have drawn water in joy from the Savior's fountain; may His Blood, we beseech Thee, become for us a fountain of water springing up unto life everlasting. Who livest and reignest...
