TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** *Psalm 54: 17, 18, 20, 23.* When I cried to the Lord He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me; and He humbled them, Who is before all ages, and remains for ever: cast thy care upon the Lord, and He shall sustain thee. *Ps. 54: 2.* Hear, O God, my prayer, and despise not my supplication; be attentive to me and hear me. Glory be. When I cried to the Lord.

**Collect:** O God, Who dost chiefly manifest Thy power in forbearance and mercy, multiply upon us Thy pity, that, hastening on to Thy promises, we may be made partakers of the blessings of heaven. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *I Corinthians 12: 2-11.* Brethren, you know that when you were heathens, you went to dumb idols, according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God, saith Anathema to Jesus; and no man can say, The Lord Jesus, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of graces, but the same Spirit; and there are diversities of ministries, but the same Lord; and there are diversities of operations, but the same God, Who worketh all in all. And the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man unto profit. To one indeed, by the Spirit, is given the word of wisdom; and to another, the word of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another, the grace of healing in one Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another the discerning of spirits; to another, divers kinds of tongues; to another, interpretation of speeches. But all these things one and the same Spirit worketh, dividing to every one according as He will.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 16: 8, 2.* Keep me, O Lord, as the apple of Thy eye: protect me under the shadow of Thy wings. Let my judgment come forth from Thy countenance: let Thy eyes behold the things that are equitable. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 64: 2.* A hymn, O God, becometh Thee in Sion: and a vow shall be paid to Thee in Jerusalem. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. Luke 18: 9-14.* At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves as just, and despised others: Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one was a pharisee, and the other a publican. The pharisee standing, prayed thus with himself: O God, I give Thee thanks that I am not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers; as also is this publican. I fast twice in the week; I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican standing afar off, would not so much as lift up his eyes towards heaven, but struck his breast, saying, O God, be merciful to me a sinner. I say to you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

**Offertory:** *Psalm 24: 1, 3.* To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded.

**Secret:** Let the sacrifices dedicated to Thee, O Lord, be rendered back, since Thou hast given them to be presented for the honor of Thy name, so that in them Thou mightest afford us a remedy for all our ills. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Psalm 50: 21.* Thou wilt accept the sacrifice of justice, oblations, and holocausts, upon Thy altar, O Lord.

**Postcommunion:** O Lord, our God, we pray that in Thy loving-kindness Thou wilt not deprive of Thine assistance those whom Thou cease not to restore with divine sacraments. Through our Lord.

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## PLENARY INDULGENCE ON AUGUST 2

### The Portiuncula Indulgence

The little chapel called "Portiuncula" was erected under Pope Liberius (352-66) by hermits from the Valley of Josaphat, who had brought thither relics from the Tomb of the Blessed Virgin. The chapel passed into the possession of the Order of St. Benedict in 516. It was known as Our Lady of the Valley of Josaphat or of the Angels -- the latter title referring to Our Lady's entering into heaven accompanied by angels on the Solemnity of the Assumption.

On February 24, 1208, the Feast of St. Matthias, while hearing Mass at the Portiuncula, St. Francis of Assisi recognized his vocation in the day's Gospel.

Francis made the Portiuncula the headquarters of his Order while refusing to accept ownership of it from the Benedictines. Francis settled on presenting the Benedictines a yearly rent of a basket of fish, thereby feeling comfortable about using the chapel and the huts the friars built around it.

On October 3, 1226, after blessing his friars and asking to be laid on the ground, Francis died at the Portiuncula after recommending the chapel to the faithful protection and care of his brethren.

### The Indulgence

One night in 1216, Francis awoke and felt a strong impulse to enter the chapel of the Portiuncula and pray. While at prayer, Our Lord and Our Lady appeared to Francis and asked him what he desired. Thinking of others and recognizing his own sinfulness, Francis spoke. "O God, although I am a great sinner, I beseech You to grant a full pardon of all sins to all who, having repented and confessed their sins, shall visit this church."

Our Lord answered, "Francis, you ask much, but you are worthy of greater things, and greater things you shall have."

The Lord granted the Indulgence and Pope Honorius III ratified it. Originally the Indulgence was attached only to the Portiuncula. However, subsequent Popes expanded the churches in which the Indulgence can be gained.

### How to obtain the Indulgence

A Plenary Indulgence remits all the temporal punishment due to sin, and it may be applied to the person himself or to a soul in Purgatory. In order to gain a plenary indulgence, one has to be free from any attachment to sin, mortal or venial. If there is any attachment to venial sin, the Indulgence is only partial.

The Indulgence may now be gained in any basilica, cathedral, or parish church on August 2nd. The person wishing to gain the Indulgence must fulfill the following requirements:

- a. Intend to gain the Indulgence;
- b. Be detached from all sin;
- c. While in the parish church\* pray one Our Father and one Apostle's Creed;
- d. Pray for the intentions of the Pope (Our Father, Hail Mary and a Glory be);
- e. Receive Holy Communion on the day of the visit to the church. Confession should also take place, but it can happen one week before or after (but the person has to be in state of grace on the day of prescribed work in order to receive the indulgence).

*\*Saint Mary's is an Oratory. The indulgence must be obtained by visiting one of the above-mentioned churches.*
