**THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST**

**Introit: Ps. 73, 20, 19, 23.** Have regard, O Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, and forget not the voices of them that seek Thee. **Ps. 73, 1.** O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end: why is Thy wrath enkindled against the sheep of Thy pasture? *V.* Glory.

**Collect:** Almighty, eternal God, grant us the increase of faith, hope, and charity; and, that we may deserve to attain what Thou dost promise, make us to love what Thou dost command. Through our Lord.

**Epistle: Gal. 3, 16-22.** Brethren, To Abraham were the promises made, and to his seed. He saith not, And to his seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed, which is Christ. Now this I say, that the testament which was confirmed by God, the law which was made after four hundred and thirty years, doth not disannul; to make the promise of no effect. For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise. Why then was the law? It was set because of transgressions, until the seed should come, to whom He made the promise: being ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. Now a mediator is not of one: but God is one. Was the law then against the promises of God? God forbid. For if there had been a law given, which could give life, verily justice should have been by the law. But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by the faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

**Gradual: Ps. 73, 20, 19, 22.** Have regard, O Lord, to Thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor. *V.* Arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause: remember the reproach of Thy servants. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 89, 1.** Lord, Thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. Alleluia.

**Gospel: Luke 17, 11-19.** At that time, As Jesus was going to Jerusalem, He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee: and as He entered into a certain town, there met Him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off, and lifted up their voice, saying, Jesus, master, have mercy on us. Whom when He saw, He said, Go, show yourselves to the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice, glorifying God: and he fell on his face before His feet, giving thanks: and this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering, said, Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return, and give glory to God, but this stranger. And He said to him, Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole.

**Offertory: Ps. 30, 15, 16.** In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped: I said, Thou art my God, my times are in Thy hands.

**Secret:** Look with favor upon Thy people, O Lord, look with favor upon their gifts; that, being appeased by this oblation, Thou mayest give us pardon and grant us what we ask. Through our Lord.

**Communion: Wis. 16, 20.** Thou hast given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, having in it all that is delicious, and the sweetness of every taste.

**Postcommunion:** Having received Thy heavenly sacraments, O Lord, we beseech Thee that we may profit unto the increase of everlasting salvation. Through our Lord.

**We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!**

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. During the summer, weather permitting, we meet at Oak Island Park after the 10:30 am High Mass. Please join us.

Holy Mass is celebrated here in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.
