FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** *Psalm 85: 1, 2, 3.* Bow down Thy ear, O Lord, to me, and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all day. *Ps. 85: 4.* Give joy to the soul of Thy servant; for to Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul. *V.* Glory. Bow down Thy ear.

**Collect:** Let Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and fortify Thy Church; and, because without Thee it can not be safely established, let it ever be governed by Thy grace. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Galatians 5: 25, 26; 6: 1-10.* Brethren, if we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let every one prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the Faith.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 91: 2, 3.* It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Thy name, O most High. *V.* To show forth Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth in the night. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 94: 3.* For the Lord is a great God, and a great king above all the earth. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. Luke 7: 11-16.* At that time, Jesus went into a city called Naim; and there went with Him His disciples, and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother; and she was a widow, and much people of the city were with her. And when the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her, and said to her, Weep not. And He came near, and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said, Young man, I say to thee, Arise: and he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And He delivered him to his mother. And there came a fear on them all: and they glorified God, saying, A great prophet is risen up amongst us and God hath visited His people.

**Offertory:** *Psalm 39: 2, 3, 4.* With expectation I have waited for the Lord, and He had regard to me; and He heard my prayer, and He put a new canticle into my mouth, a song to our God.

**Secret:** May Thy sacraments, O Lord, keep us and guard us always from the assaults of the devil. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *St. John 6: 52.* The bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world.

**Postcommunion:** Let the operation of the heavenly gift, O Lord, possess our souls and bodies, that, its holy grace, not our own impulses, may continually be our guide. Through our Lord.

**We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!**

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. During the summer, weather permitting, we meet at Oak Island Park after the 10:30 am High Mass. Please join us.

Holy Mass is celebrated here in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.
