THE SEVEN SORROWS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Introit: *John 19: 25-27.* There stood by the Cross of Jesus, His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary of Cleophas, and Salome, and Mary Magdalene. *℟.* Woman, behold thy son, said Jesus; and to the disciple, Behold thy mother. *℣.* Glory.

Collect: O God, in Whose Passion a sword of sorrow pierced the most dear soul of the glorious Virgin-Mother, Mary, as foretold by Simeon, mercifully grant that we, who reverently commemorate her sorrows, may obtain the happy effect of Thy passion. Who livest.

Epistle: *Judith 13: 22-25.* The Lord hath blessed thee by His power, Who by thee hath brought our enemies to nought. Blessed art thou, O daughter, by the Lord the Most High God, above all women upon the earth. Blessed be the Lord Who made heaven and earth, because He hath so magnified thy name this day, that thy praise shall not depart out of the mouth of men, who shall be mindful of the power of the Lord forever: for that thou hast not spared thy life by reason of the distress and tribulation of thy people, but hast prevented our ruin in the presence of our God.

Gradual: Sorrowful and tearful art thou, O Virgin Mary, standing by the cross of the Lord Jesus, thy Son and Redeemer. *℟.* O Virgin Mother of God, He Whom the whole earth containeth not, the Author of life, made man, beareth this anguish of the cross.

Alleluia: Alleluia, alleluia. *℟.* Holy Mary, queen of heaven and mistress of the world, stood by the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ, sorrowing. Alleluia.

Through her heart, His sorrow sharing, All His bitter anguish bearing Now at length the sword had passed.	O sweet Mother! fount of love, Touch my spirit from above, Make my heart with thine accord.	Let me, to my latest breath, In my body bear the death Of that dying Son of thine.
Oh, how sad and sore distressed Was that Mother highly blessed Of the sole begotten One!	Make me feel as thou hast felt; Make my soul to glow and melt With the love of Christ, my Lord.	Wounded with His every wound, Steep my soul till it has swooned In His very Blood away.
Christ above in torment hangs, She beneath beholds the pangs Of her dying, glorious Son.	Holy Mother, pierce me through, In my heart each wound renew Of my Saviour crucified.	Be to me, O Virgin, nigh, Lest in flames I burn and die, In this awful judgment day.
Is there one who would not weep 'Whelmed in miseries so deep Christ's dear Mother's pain untold.	Let me share with thee His pain, Who for all our sins was slain, Who for me in torments died.	Christ, when Thou shalt call me hence, Be Thy Mother my defense, Be Thy Cross my victory.
Can the human heart refrain From partaking in her pain, In that Mother's pain untold?	Mix'd with thine let my tears be, Mourning Him Who mourned for me, All the days that I may live.	While my body here decays, May my soul Thy goodness praise, Safe in heaven eternally. Amen. Alleluia.

Gospel: *John 19: 25-27.* At that time, there stood by the cross of Jesus, His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus, therefore, had seen His mother and the disciple standing, whom He loved, He saith to His mother, Woman, behold thy son. After that He saith to the disciple, Behold thy mother. And from that hour the disciple took her to his own.

Offertory: Remember, O Virgin Mother of God, when thou standest in the presence of the Lord, that thou speak good things for us and turn His wrath from us.

Secret: We offer Thee prayers and sacrifices, O Lord Jesus Christ, humbly entreating that we, who commemorate in our prayers the piercing of the most dear soul of blessed Mary, Thy Mother, may, through the multiplied intercession of her and of her holy companions under the cross, by the merits of Thy death, receive our portion with the blessed. Who livest.

Communion: Happy the senses of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which without death earned the palm of martyrdom beneath the cross of our Lord.

Postcommunion: May the sacrifices of which we have partaken, O Lord Jesus Christ, devoutly celebrating the piercing of Thy virgin Mother's soul, obtain for us, with Thy clemency the effect of every salutary benefit. Who livest.
