NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: I am the salvation of the people, saith the Lord: in whatever tribulation they shall cry to Me I will hear them; and I will be their Lord for ever. *Ps. 77: 1.* Attend, O My people, to My law; incline your ears to the words of My mouth. Glory be. I am the salvation.

Collect: Almighty and merciful God, in Thy loving-kindness do Thou keep us from all things that war against us, that, being unhampered alike in soul and in body, we may with free minds perform the works that are Thine. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Ephesians 4: 23-28.* Brethren, Be ye renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who according to God is created in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore, putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry, and sin not. Let not the sun go down upon your anger. Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more; but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

Gradual: *Psalm 140: 2.* Let my prayer be directed as incense in Thy sight, O Lord. *V.* The lifting up of my hands as evening sacrifice. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 104: 1.* Give glory to the Lord, and call upon His name: declare His deeds among the gentiles. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 22: 2-14.* At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying, Tell them that were invited, Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready; come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants, The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests; and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment: and he saith to him, Friend, how camest thou in hither, not having on a wedding garment? but he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters, Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen.

Offertory: *Psalm 137: 7.* If I shall walk in the midst of tribulation, Thou wilt quicken me, O Lord; and Thou wilt stretch forth Thy hand against the wrath of my enemies: and Thy right hand shall save me.

Secret: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that these gifts, which we offer up in the sight of Thy majesty, may be salutary unto us. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Psalm 118: 4, 5.* Thou hast commanded Thy commandments to be kept most diligently: O that my ways may be directed to keep Thy justifications.

Postcommunion: Let Thy healing power, O Lord, in mercy deliver us from our waywardness and cause us ever to cleave to Thy commandments. Through our Lord.

Priest Assignments for St. Mary's Oratory, 2023-2024

Now that the General Chapter of the Institute of Christ the King is past, and the priest assignments are being finalized throughout the growing American Province, we would like to make you aware of the changes that will be taking place here at St. Mary's Oratory.

Canon Huberfeld will continue in his role as rector of the Oratory this coming year and will be present on most weekends. He will maintain his duties in the Diocese of La Crosse as a member of the Presbyteral Council and as the Bishop's delegate for all matters concerning the celebration of the traditional Roman liturgy in the diocese. He will also continue as Vice Provincial for the American Province of the Institute, as National Chaplain of the Society of the Sacred Heart, and as chaplain to the Sister Adorers here in Wausau.

In addition, Canon Huberfeld has been named director of the Institute's new Sacred Heart Retreat Center in Burlington, Wisconsin. He has also been asked by the Institute's Prior General to pursue higher studies with a goal of obtaining a licentiate in sacred theology, specializing in patristics. He will be pursuing this program remotely through St. Augustine's Seminary of the University of Toronto.

Canon Matheus, who has been serving faithfully as our Vicar since 2017, has been named Vice Rector of the Oratory. What this means concretely is that, with Canon Huberfeld's frequent absences from Wausau on weekdays, daily pastoral matters, especially the scheduling of Sacraments, should be addressed through Canon Matheus. Canon Matheus will continue to teach adult theology and catechism along with the sisters and train the altar servers. In addition, he will oversee the formation of the four seminary candidates assigned to Wausau for the year.

We are grateful for the continued presence of Fr. Eduardo de la Torre here at the Oratory. As he continues his sabbatical, he will remain at your disposition for your Sacramental needs.

Our three Sister Adorers will continue teaching catechism and conducting the Company of the Immaculate. We are grateful for their efforts toward our children and, above all, for their prayer apostolate of daily adoration for the sanctification of priests.

As we pray for our priests this coming year, let us also acknowledge important part played by our Oratory staff in maintaining the vibrant life of our community. Our secretary Dr. Terry Scheid, our music director Mr. Patrick Burkhart, our property manager Mr. Thomas Schrader, our accountant Mrs. Karla Michanowicz, and our groundskeepers Justin and Michael Borger all do a marvelous job keeping the church functioning at its best so that our priests are free to tend to their sacred duties. We are grateful for their patience and good humor!

A special thanks goes to our many volunteers who clean and care for the church and the gardens, run the gift shop, and prepare meals for the priory, as well as to our faithful team of ushers. Your generous donation of time and effort is not forgotten.
