FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Introit: *Psalm 90: 15, 16.* He shall call upon Me, and I will hear him; I will deliver him, and glorify him; I will fill him with length of days. *Ps. 90: 1.* He that dwelleth in the aid of the Most High, shall abide under the protection of the God of heaven. Glory be. He shall call upon Me.

Collect: O God, Who dost purify Thy Church with the annual observance of Lent, grant to Thy household that what it strives to obtain from Thee by abstinence it may secure with good works. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *II Corinthians 6: 1-10.* Brethren, we exhort you that you receive not the grace of God in vain. For He saith, In an accepted time have I heard thee, and in the day of salvation have I helped thee. Behold now is the acceptable time, behold now is the day of salvation. Giving no offense to any man, that our ministry be not blamed: but in all things let us exhibit ourselves as the ministers of God; in much patience, in tribulations, in necessities, in distresses, in stripes, in prisons, in seditions, in labors, in watchings, in fastings, in chastity, in knowledge, in long-suffering, in sweetness, in the Holy Ghost, in charity unfeigned, in the word of truth, in the power of God; by the armor of justice on the right hand and on the left, by honor and dishonor, by evil report and good report; as deceivers, and yet true; as unknown, and yet known; as dying, and behold we live; as chastised, and not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as needy, yet enriching many; as having nothing, and possessing all things.

Gradual: *Psalm 90: 11, 12.* God hath given His angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways. *V.* In their hands they shall bear thee up, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone.

Tract: *Psalm 90: 1-7, 11-16.* He that dwelleth in the aid of the Most High, shall abide under the protection of the God of heaven. *V.* He shall say to the Lord, Thou art my protector and my refuge: my God, in Him will I trust. *V.* For He hath delivered me from the snare of the hunters, and from the sharp word. *V.* He will overshadow thee with His shoulders, and under His wings thou shalt trust. *V.* His truth shall compass thee with a shield: thou shalt not be afraid of the terror of the night. *V.* Of the arrow that flieth in the day; of the business that walketh about in the dark: of ruin and the noonday devil. *V.* A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand: but it shall not come nigh to thee. *V.* For He hath given His angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways. *V.* In their hands they shall bear thee up, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone. *V.* Thou shalt walk upon the asp and the basilisk, and thou shalt trample under foot the lion and the dragon. *V.* Because he hath hoped in Me, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he hath known My name. *V.* He shall call upon Me, and I will hear him: I am with him in tribulation. *V.* I will deliver him, and I will glorify him; I will fill him with length of days, and I will show him My salvation.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 4: 1-11.* At that time, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert, to be tempted by the devil. And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterwards He was hungry. And the tempter coming said to Him, If Thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread. Who answered and said: It is written, Not in bread alone doth man live, but in every word that proceedeth from the mouth of God. Then the devil took Him up into the holy city, and set Him upon the pinnacle of the temple, and said to Him, If Thou be the Son of God, cast Thyself down: for it is written, That He hath given His angels charge over Thee, and in their hands shall they bear Thee up, lest perhaps Thou dash Thy foot against a stone. Jesus said to him, It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God. Again the devil took Him up into a very high mountain; and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world, and the glory of them; and said to Him, All these will I give Thee, if falling down Thou wilt adore me. Then Jesus said to him, Begone, Satan, for it is written, The Lord thy God shalt thou adore, and Him only shalt thou serve. Then the devil left Him; and behold angels came, and ministered to Him.

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Fasting Rules</u></p> <p>All Catholics having attained their 14th year are required to abstain from flesh meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. Those aged 18 through 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On a fast day, only one full meal may be taken, but one could add two smaller meals which together do not equal a full meal.</p> <p>Although the fasting and abstinence detailed above is what is required of Catholics, all of the days of Lent are designated by the universal law of the Church as days of penance <i>“on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their own obligations more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence, according to the norm of the [above cited] canons.”</i> (CIC Can. 1249).</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Spiritual Reading for Lent</u></p> <p>This Lent, we would like to recommend the reading of an amazing book by Saint Alphonsus of Liguori called <i>Preparation for Death.</i></p> <p>The book has as its goal to make us consider the vanity of the things of this world and to place our attention on the things that really matter, preparing us for the “hour of truth”, our own Judgment, which is coming soon. 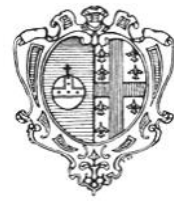

Preface of Lent: It is truly meet and just, right and profitable, for us, at all times, and in all places, to give thanks to Thee, O Lord, the holy One, the Father almighty, the everlasting God: Who on those who chastise their bodies by fasting dost bestow the restraining of evil passions, uplifting of heart, and the enjoying of virtue with its reward. Through Christ our Lord. Through Whom the angels praise, the dominations adore, the powers, trembling with awe, worship Thy majesty: which the heavens, and the forces of heaven, together with the blessed seraphim, joyfully do magnify. And do Thou command that it be permitted to our lowliness to join with them in confessing Thee and unceasingly to repeat: Holy, Holy, Holy . . .
