THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

Introit: *Psalm 65: 1, 2.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, alleluia; sing ye a psalm to His name, alleluia: give glory to His praise. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 65: 3.* Say unto God, how terrible are Thy works, O Lord! In the multitude of Thy strength Thy enemies shall lie to Thee. Glory be. Shout with joy.

Collect: O God, Who dost show the light of Thy truth to them that go astray, that they may be able to return to the path of justice, grant unto all who profess themselves and are reckoned Christians, both to reject the things that are opposed to that name and to follow after the things that befit it. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *1 Peter 2: 11-19.* Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, to refrain yourselves from carnal desires which war against the soul, having your conversation good among the gentiles: that whereas they speak against you as evil-doers, they may by the good works, which they shall behold in you, glorify God in the day of visitation. Be ye subject therefore to every human creature for God's sake: whether it be to the king as excelling: or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers, and for the praise of the good: for so is the will of God, that by doing well you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men. As free, and not as making liberty a cloak for malice, but as the servants of God. Honor all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king. Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the severe. For this is indeed a grace in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Alleluia: Alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 110: 9.* The Lord hath sent redemption to His people. Alleluia. *St. Luke 24: 46.* It behooved Christ to suffer these things, and so to enter into His glory. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. John 16: 16-22.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, A little while, and now you shall not see Me; and again a little while, and you shall see Me; because I go to the Father. Then some of His disciples said one to another, What is this that He saith to us, A little while, and you shall not see Me; and again a little while, and you shall see Me; and because I go to the Father? They said therefore, What is this that He saith, A little while? we know not what He speaketh. And Jesus knew that they had a mind to ask Him: and He said to them, Of this do you inquire among yourselves because I said, A little while, and you shall not see Me; and again a little while, and you shall see Me? Amen, amen, I say to you, that you shall lament and weep, but the world shall rejoice; and you shall be made sorrowful, but your sorrow shall be turned into joy. A woman when she is in labor hath sorrow, because her hour is come; but when she hath brought forth the child, she remembereth no more the anguish, for joy that a man is born into the world. So also you now indeed have sorrow, but I will see you again, and your heart shall rejoice, and your joy no man shall take from you.

Offertory: *Psalm 145: 2.* Praise the Lord, O my soul, in my life I will praise the Lord: I will sing to my God as long as I shall be. Alleluia.

Secret: By these mysteries, O Lord, may grace be given us so that, chastening our earthly desires, we may learn to love heavenly things. Through our Lord.

Communion: *St. John 16: 16.* A little while, and now you shall not see Me, alleluia: and again a little while, and you shall see Me: because I go to the Father. Alleluia, alleluia.

Postcommunion: May the sacrament we have received, O Lord, we beseech Thee, both restore us with its spiritual nourishment and protect us with its help for our bodies. Through our Lord.

Commemoration of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima Friday, May 13th

In this year which has witnessed the consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by the Pope in union with the bishops of the world, our Prior General Msgr. Wach exhorts us all to renew our commitment to the message of Fatima by our fervent prayers and sacrifices in reparation for all the offenses against the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He encourages us to prepare for the anniversary of the apparitions by keeping Thursday, May 12th as a day of fast and abstinence.

On Friday, May 13th, please join us for a High Mass at 8am followed by a Marian procession. At the conclusion of the ceremony, we will pronounce the following act of consecration in union with all the members of the Institute throughout the world:

O Holy Virgin Mary, our Mother and our Queen, who didst appear at Fatima and didst promise, if thy requests were heeded, to convert Russia and bring peace to the world, I respond to thy call.

I consecrate myself to thine Immaculate Heart, wishing to remember unceasingly that I belong to thee and that thou canst dispose of me for the reign of the Sacred Heart of thy divine Son.

I promise thee, in reparation for the sins thou hast so painfully deplored:

- ◆ *To offer each day the sacrifices necessary for the Christian fulfillment of my daily duties;*
- ◆ *To recite each day a part of the Rosary, uniting myself to the mysteries of the life of Jesus and thine own.*

*Our Lady of Fatima, keep me faithful.
St. Joseph, help me to serve.
St. Michael, defend me in battle.*

We will offer a Holy Hour at 5:00 PM followed by Vespers and Benediction, at which time we will recite again this prayer of consecration.
