SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit: Ps. 17, 19, 20.** The Lord became my protector, and He brought me forth into a large place: He saved me, because He was well pleased with me. **Ps. 17, 2, 3.** I will love Thee, O Lord my strength: the Lord is my firmament, and my refuge, and my deliverer. *V.* Glory.

**Collect:** Grant us, O Lord, an abiding fear and love of Thy holy name, for Thou never failest to govern those whom Thou dost firmly establish in Thy love. Through our Lord.

**Epistle: 1 John 3, 13-18.** Dearly beloved, Wonder not if the world hate you. We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not, abideth in death. Whosoever hateth his brother is a murderer: and you know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in himself. In this we have known the charity of God, because He hath laid down His life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. He that hath the substance of this world, and shall see his brother in need, and shut up his bowels from him, how doth the charity of God abide in him? My little children, let us not love in word nor in tongue, but in deed and in truth.

**Gradual: Ps. 119, 1, 2.** In my trouble I cried to the Lord, and He heard me. *V.* O Lord, deliver my soul from wicked lips and a deceitful tongue. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 7, 2.** O Lord my God, in Thee have I put my trust: save me from all them that persecute me, and deliver me. Alleluia.

**Gospel: Luke 14, 16-24.** At that time, Jesus spoke to the pharisees this parable: A certain man made a great supper, and invited many. And he sent his servant, at the hour of supper, to say to them that were invited, that they should come, for now all things were ready. And they began all at once to make excuse. The first said to him, I have bought a farm, and must needs go out, and see it; I pray thee to hold me excused. And another said, I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to try them; I pray thee hold me excused. And another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come. And the servant returning, told these things to his lord. Then the master of the house being angry, said to his servant, Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in hither the poor, and the feeble and the blind, and the lame. And the servant said, Lord, it is done as Thou hast commanded, and yet there is room. And the lord said to the servant go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. But I say unto you, that none of these men that were invited shall taste of my supper.

**Offertory: Ps. 6, 5.** Turn to me, O Lord, and deliver my soul, O save me for Thy mercy's sake.

**Secret:** Let the oblation about to be offered to Thy holy name, O Lord, purify us and day by day change us to the living of the heavenly life. Through our Lord.

**Communion: Ps. 12.** I will sing to the Lord, Who giveth me good things: and I will sing to the name of the Lord the most high.

**Postcommunion:** Having received Thy sacred gifts, we pray, O Lord, that, as we now frequently assist at this mystery so may it cause to increase the grace of our salvation. Through our Lord.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisle.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction.
