#### FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** *Psalm 83: 10, 11.* Behold, O God, our protector, and look on the face of Thy Christ: for better is one day in Thy courts above thousands. *Ps. 83: 2, 3.* How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts! my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. *V.* Glory be. Behold, O God.

**Collect:** Guard Thy church, we beseech Thee, O Lord, with Thy continual kindness; and, because without Thee human frailty falleth, let it, by Thine assistance, ever be both withheld from harm and guided to what is salutary. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Galatians 5: 16-24.* Brethren: Walk in the spirit, and you shall not fulfil the lusts of the flesh: for the flesh lusteth against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh; for these are contrary one to another; so that you do not the things that you would. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest; which are, fornication, uncleanness, immodesty, luxury, idolatry, witchcrafts, enmities, contentions, emulations, wraths, quarrels, dissensions, sects, envies, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like; of the which I foretell you, as I have foretold to you, that they who do such things shall not obtain the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the spirit is, charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity. Against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified their flesh with the vices and concupiscences.

**Gradual:** *Ps. 117: 8, 9.* It is good to confide in the Lord, rather than to have confidence in man. *V.* It is good to trust in the Lord, rather than to trust in princes. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Psalm 94, 1.* Come, let us praise the Lord with joy; let us joyfully sing to God our Saviour. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. Matthew 6: 24-33.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow, nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are not you of much more value than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin; but I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. Now if God so clothe the grass of the field, which is to-day, and to-morrow is cast into the oven, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous therefore, saying, what shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? for after all these things do the heathen seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and His justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.

**Offertory:** *Ps. 33: 8, 9.* The angel of the Lord shall encamp round about them that fear Him, and shall deliver them. O taste, and see that the Lord is sweet!

**Secret:** Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that this saving Victim may become both the cleansing of our sins, and the propitiation of Thy might. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *St. Matthew 6: 33.* Seek first the kingdom of God; and all things shall be added unto you, saith the Lord.

**Postcommunion:** May Thy Sacraments, O God, ever purify and fortify us, and bring us to the effect of everlasting salvation. Through our Lord.

Dear Faithful,

Thanks in large part to your prayers and contributions, God continues to bless the Institute with more growth in its apostolates throughout twelve countries worldwide. The recent Chapter meeting at our Motherhouse in Gricigliano, Italy (August 29–September 2), included a focus on provincial leadership and headquarters in each country improving support and coordination with the Institute clergy at their individual apostolates. In light of this, new vice-provincials have been appointed by our Prior General in several of the Institute provinces, including in the United States.

Thus, I am happy to inform you that the new Vice-Provincial of the U.S. Province is **Canon Aaron Huberfeld**. While Canon Huberfeld continues to serve as Rector of St. Mary's in Wausau, Wisconsin, and Chaplain to the Sisters Adorers at their nearby convent, he will also assist the U.S. Provincial Superior with various matters relating to the work and mission of the Institute across the country.

While Canon Huberfeld remains the National Chaplain of the Society of the Sacred Heart, which is the lay branch of the Institute family, an assistant Chaplain for the Society has also been appointed, **Canon Michael Stein**. Canon Stein will help the Society to provide more meetings for its growing membership in the Institute apostolates.

**Canon Michael Stein** is also appointed auxiliary priest at Old St. Patrick's Oratory in Kansas City, Missouri, where he will reside at the Institute's priory. Furthermore, Canon Stein is named Director of Spiritual Formation for the clerical oblate candidates at St. Francis de Sales Oratory in St. Louis, Missouri.

**Canon Erwan Josseaume** is appointed Vicar of St. Stanislaus Oratory in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

**Canon David Le** is appointed chaplain for the Institute's Sunday Mass apostolate in Sheboygan, Wisconsin (Archdiocese of Milwaukee), while continuing his duties as Secretary of the U.S. Province.
