TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: *Jeremiah 29: 11, 12, 14.* The Lord said, I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Ps. 84: 2.* Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory. The Lord said.

Collect: Remit, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the sins of Thy people, that by Thy kindness we may be delivered from the trammels of our sins, in which, through our frailty, we have become entangled. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Philippians 3: 17-21 & 4: 1-3.* Brethren, be ye followers of me, and observe them who walk so as you have our model. For many walk, of whom I have told you often (and now tell you weeping) that they are enemies of the cross of Christ; whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame; who mind earthly things. But our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ, Who will reform the body of our lowliness, made like to the body of His glory, according to the operation whereby also He is able to subdue all things unto Himself. Therefore, my brethren, dearly beloved, and most desired, my joy and my crown: so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved: I beg of Evodia, and I beseech Syntyche to be of one mind in the Lord: and I entreat thee also, my sincere companion, help those women who have labored with me in the gospel with Clement and the rest of my fellow-laborers, whose names are in the book of life.

Gradual: *Ps. 43: 8, 9.* Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. *V.* In God we will glory all the day; and in Thy name we will give praise for ever. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 129: 1, 2.* From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 9: 18-26.* At that time, As Jesus was speaking to the multitudes, behold a certain ruler came up, and adored Him, saying, Lord, my daughter is even now dead; but come lay Thy hand upon her, and she shall live. And Jesus, rising up, followed him with His disciples. And behold a woman, who was troubled with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind Him, and touched the hem of His garment. For she said within herself, If I shall touch only His garment, I shall be healed. But Jesus turning and seeing her, said, Be of good heart, daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour. And when Jesus was come into the house of the ruler, and saw the minstrels and the multitude making a tumult, He said, Give place; for the girl is not dead, but sleepeth. And they laughed Him to scorn. And when the multitude was put forth, He went in, and took her by the hand. And the maid arose. And the fame hereof went abroad into all that country.

Offertory: *Ps. 129: 1, 2.* From the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord; Lord, hear my prayer: from the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord.

Secret: We offer Thee, O Lord, the sacrifice of praise for the increase of our service, that Thou mayest graciously complete that which, for no merit of ours, Thou hast granted unto us. Through our Lord.

Communion: *St. Mark 11: 24.* Amen I say to you, whatsoever, you ask when you pray, believe that you shall receive, and it shall be done to you.

Postcommunion: We pray Thee, O almighty God, that Thou wilt not suffer to be overcome by human dangers those to whom Thou grantest participation in things that are divine. Through our Lord.

What does it mean to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father?

The conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession within about a week's time, reception of Holy Communion, and reciting some prayers (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary) for the intentions of the Holy Father. This is different from praying for the Holy Father himself, as we do at Mass. What, precisely, does it mean to pray for his intentions?

According to the Church's official decree on indulgences, the Pope's intention, in virtue of his office, always includes the following objects:

1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church.
2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers.
3. The conversion of sinners.
4. The uprooting of heresy.

It is good for you to have these specific intentions in mind when you pray for the Holy Father's intentions. Even if you do not think of them specifically, however, your prayer is still valid, as they are included in the intention of Holy Mother Church. Of course the Pope may have other personal intentions, but it is not necessary that these form a part of your prayer.
