FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Introit: *Ps. 24: 1-3.* To Thee, O Lord have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Neither let my enemies laugh at me; for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps. 24: 4.* Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. To Thee, O Lord.

Collect: Stir up, O Lord, Thy might, we pray Thee and come; That, defended by Thee, we may deserve rescue from approaching dangers brought on by our sins, and being set free by Thee, obtain our salvation. Who livest.

Epistle: *Romans 13: 11-14.* Brethren, knowing the time, that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is past, and the day is at hand; let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light. Let us walk honestly as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy; but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gradual: *Ps. 24: 3, 4.* None of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *V.* Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 84: 8.* Show us, O Lord, Thy mercy: and grant us Thy salvation. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Luke 21: 25-33.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: There shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars: and upon the earth distress of nations, by reason of the confusion of the roaring of the sea and of the waves, men withering away for fear and expectation of what shall come upon the whole world. For the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand. And He spoke to them a similitude: See the fig-tree, and all the trees: when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh; so you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen I say to you, this generation shall not pass away, till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away.

Offertory: *Ps. 24: 1-3.* To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded.

Secret: Cleansing us by their mighty power, may these Holy Mysteries, O Lord, make us come more pure before Thee who art their author. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Ps. 84: 13.* The Lord will give goodness: and our earth shall yield her fruit.

Postcommunion: May we receive Thy mercy, O Lord, in the midst of Thy temple, that with due reverence we may prepare for the coming festival of our redemption. Through our Lord.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.
