TWENTIETH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: *Daniel 3: 31, 29, 35.* All that Thou hast done to us, O Lord, Thou hast done in true judgment; because we have sinned against Thee, and we have not obeyed Thy commandments: but give glory to Thy name, and deal with us according to the multitude of Thy mercy. *Ps. 118: 1.* Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be. All that Thou hast done.

Collect: Being appeased, O Lord, grant to Thy faithful in abundance, we beseech Thee, both forgiveness and peace, that they may both be cleansed from all offenses and with a quiet mind give themselves to Thy service. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Ephesians 5: 15-21.* Brethren, See how you walk circumspectly, not as unwise, but as wise; redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore, become not unwise, but understanding what is the will of God. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is luxury: but be ye filled with the holy Spirit, speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord: giving thanks always for all things, in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to God and the Father; being subject one to another in the fear of Christ.

Gradual: *Psalms 144: 15, 16.* The eyes of all hope in Thee, O Lord; and Thou givest them meat in due season. Thou openest Thy hand, and fillest every living creature with Thy blessing. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 107: 2.* My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready: I will sing, and will give praise to Thee, my glory. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. John 4: 46-53.* At that time, There was a certain ruler whose son was sick at Capharnaum. He having heard that Jesus was come from Judea into Galilee, went to Him, and prayed Him to come down, and heal his son; for he was at the point of death. Jesus therefore said to him, Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not. The ruler saith to Him, Lord, come down before that my son die. Jesus saith to him, Go thy way, thy son liveth. The man believed the word which Jesus said to him, and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him, and they brought word, saying, that his son lived. He asked therefore of them the hour wherein he grew better. And they said to him, yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. The father therefore knew that it was at the same hour that Jesus said to him, Thy son liveth; and himself believed, and his whole house.

Offertory: *Psalms 136: 1.* Upon the rivers of Babylon, there we sat and wept; when we remembered Thee, O Sion.

Secret: Let these mysteries, we beseech Thee, O Lord, be our heavenly medicine and purge the evil from our hearts. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Ps. 118: 49, 50.* Be thou mindful of Thy word to Thy servant, O Lord, in which Thou hast given me hope: this hath comforted me in my humiliation.

Postcommunion: That we may be rendered worthy of Thy sacred gifts, O Lord, grant us, we beseech Thee, ever to obey Thy commandments. Through our Lord.

What does it mean to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father?

The conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession within about a week's time, reception of Holy Communion, and reciting some prayers (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary) for the intentions of the Holy Father. This is different from praying for the Holy Father himself, as we do at Mass. What, precisely, does it mean to pray for his intentions?

According to the Church's official decree on indulgences, the Pope's intention, in virtue of his office, always includes the following objects:

1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church.
2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers.
3. The conversion of sinners.
4. The uprooting of heresy.

It is good for you to have these specific intentions in mind when you pray for the Holy Father's intentions. Even if you do not think of them specifically, however, your prayer is still valid, as they are included in the intention of Holy Mother Church. Of course the Pope may have other personal intentions, but it is not necessary that these form a part of your prayer.
