TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: Esther 13, 9, 10, 11. All things are in Thy will, O Lord, and there is none that can resist Thy will: for thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. **Ps. 118, 1.** Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. *V.* Glory.

Collect: Keep Thy household, we beseech Thee, O Lord, with continual loving-kindness, that by Thy protection it may be free from all adversities and devoted to Thy name in well-doing. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Eph. 6, 10-17. Brethren, be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore, take unto you the armor of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and to stand in all things perfect. Stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breast plate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God.

Gradual: Ps. 89, 1, 2. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. *V.* Before the mountains were made, or the earth and the world was formed; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 113, 1.** When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a barbarous people. Alleluia.

Gospel: Matt. 18, 23-35. At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The Kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. But that servant falling down, besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go; and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow-servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying, Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not; but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow-servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved; and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him, and saith to him, Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besoughtest me; shouldst not thou then have had compassion also on thy fellow-servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry, delivered him to the torturers until he paid all the debt. So also shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts.

Offertory: Job 1. There was a man in the land of Hus, whose name was Job, simple, and upright, and fearing God: whom Satan besought that he might tempt: and power was given him from the Lord over his possessions and his flesh; and he destroyed all his substance and his children; and wounded his flesh also with a grievous ulcer.

Secret: Graciously receive, O Lord, the sacrifices with which Thou hast willed that Thou shouldst be appeased and our salvation, by Thy mighty love, restored. Through our Lord.

Communion: Ps. 118, 81, 84, 86. My soul is in Thy salvation, and in Thy word have I hoped: when wilt Thou execute judgment on them that persecute me? the wicked have persecuted me: help me, O Lord my God.

Postcommunion: Having obtained the nourishment of immortality, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that what has passed our lips we may embrace with a pure mind. Through our Lord.

ADDITIONAL SEATING IN THOMAS HALL DURING MASS

Dear Faithful,

We are grateful to Almighty God for the continued growth of our congregation here at St. Mary's. It has become clear that we have need of overflow seating on certain occasions of the year when the vast majority of our congregation is present at the same time (e.g., Midnight Mass, Good Friday). For that reason, we have now installed a video system in Thomas Hall which will allow people to see and hear the Mass and the sermon from that location. This high quality system will also prove very useful for conferences, classes and other presentations down the in hall.

Since this system is now available for use, we have decided to make it available to you on every Sunday and Holy Day throughout the year as well. We hope that families with small children will find it particularly helpful. Although you are still welcome to make use of the baptistery or the vestibule when you have a crying child, you may find that it is easier to avail yourself of this new option thanks to its greater space and proximity to the restrooms.

Please note that all persons are expected to exhibit the same conduct in the hall during Mass as they would upstairs in the nave: **modest dress, no conversation, and no use of electronic devices.**

We welcome any questions or suggestions you may have as we work to implement this new system and serve our growing flock.
