**TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST  
(FOURTH RESUMED SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY)**

**Introit:** *Jer. 29, 11, 12, 14.* The Lord saith, I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction; you shall call upon Me and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Ps. 84, 2.* Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory.

**Collect:** O God, Who knowest that we are beset by perils so great as to be unendurable because of our human frailty, grant us health of mind and body, so that by Thine assistance we may conquer the things with which we are afflicted because of our sins. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Romans 13: 8-10.* Brethren, owe no man any thing, but to love one another; for he that loveth his neighbor hath fulfilled the law. For thou shalt not commit adultery, thou shalt not kill, thou shalt not steal, thou shalt not bear false witness, thou shalt not covet, and if there be any other commandment, it is comprised in this word, thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. The love of our neighbor worketh no evil. Love, therefore, is the fulfilling of the law.

**Gradual:** *Ps. 43, 8, 9.* Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. *V.* In God we will glory all the day: and in Thy name we will give praise for ever. Alleluia, alleluia. *V. Ps. 129, 1, 2.* From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *Matt. 8: 23-27.* At that time, when Jesus entered into the ship, His disciples followed Him. And behold a great tempest arose in the sea, so that the ship was covered with waves, but He was asleep. And they came to Him, and awaked Him, saying, Lord, save us, we perish. And Jesus saith to them, Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then rising up, He commanded the winds and the sea, and there came a great calm. But the men wondered, saying, What manner of man is this, for the winds and the sea obey Him?

**Offertory:** *Ps. 129, 1, 2.* From the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer: from the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord.

**Secret:** Grant, we beseech Thee, O almighty God, that the offering of this sacrifice presented to Thee may ever purge our frailty of all evil and may fortify it. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Mark 11, 24.* Amen, I say to you, whatsoever you ask when you pray, believe that you shall receive, and it shall be done unto you.

**Postcommunion:** May Thy gifts, O God, free us from the allurements of earthly things, and ever restore us with heavenly nourishment. Through our Lord.

**What does it mean to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father?**

The conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession within about a week's time, reception of Holy Communion, and reciting some prayers (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary) for the intentions of the Holy Father. This is different from praying for the Holy Father himself, as we do at Mass. What, precisely, does it mean to pray for his intentions?

According to the Church's official decree on indulgences, the Pope's intention always includes the following objects:

1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church.
2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers.
3. The conversion of sinners.
4. The uprooting of heresy.

It is good for you to have these specific intentions in mind when you pray for the Holy Father's intentions. Even if you do not think of them specifically, however, your prayer is still valid, as they are included in the intention of Holy Mother Church. Of course the Pope may have other personal intentions, and these can form part of your prayer as well, but this is not necessary.
