SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

Introit: *Psalm 65: 4.* Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Thou most high. *Ps. 65: 1, 2.* Shout with joy to God all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name, give glory to His praise. Glory be. Let all the earth.

Collect: Almighty, eternal God, Who dost govern all things in heaven and on earth, of Thy mercy hear the supplications of Thy people, and grant Thy peace in our times. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Romans 12: 6-16.* Brethren, having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us; either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth in doctrine; he that exhorteth in exhorting; he that giveth with simplicity; he that ruleth with carefulness; he that showeth mercy with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good. Loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, in honor preventing one another. In carefulness, not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints; pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep. Being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

Gradual: *Psalm 106: 20, 21.* The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them out of their distresses. *V.* Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him; and His wonderful works to the children of men. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 148: 2.* Praise ye the Lord, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. John 2: 1-11.* At that time, there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him, They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her, Woman, what is it to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters, Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus saith to them, Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast: and they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him, Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

Offertory: *Psalm 65: 1, 2, 16.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, and I will tell you, all ye that fear God, what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

Secret: Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts we offer, and purify us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

Communion: *St. John 2: 7, 8, 9, 10, 11.* The Lord saith: Fill the waterpots with water, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: thou hast kept the good wine until now; this first miracle did Jesus before His disciples.

Postcommunion: May the working of Thy power, we beg Thee, O Lord, be increased in us, that, being nourished by divine sacraments, we may by Thy grace be prepared to obtain that which they promise. Through our Lord.

We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. Please join us after the High Mass for coffee and doughnuts in the church hall downstairs.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite, called sometimes today the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. There are booklets in the pews to aid you in following the Mass. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, don't hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you would like to have your candles blessed on that day, bring them early enough so they can be placed in the sanctuary before the 10:30 AM Mass (just place them before the communion rail). In the case you would not attend the 10:30 AM Mass and would have to drop your candles off earlier that day, please drop them in the breezeway, between the church and the priory.

Abbé Charles Outtier

With great sadness, we commend to your prayers the repose of the soul of Charles Outtier, a French seminarian of the Institute of Christ the King in Gricigliano, who was killed on January 15 in a tractor accident on the seminary grounds while he was performing his duties. Charles Outtier was a deacon preparing for priestly ordination this coming July. His unexpected and tragic death has plunged the seminary into mourning.

Deacon Outtier edified the whole community with his joyful demeanor and his fervent devotion to his duties, his studies, and his Catholic faith. He was full of promise for his future priestly ministry.

But the good Lord, who alone knows the day and hour, has called him on ahead of us.

He was anointed and received the Apostolic Blessing at the moment of his death.

A Requiem mass will be offered for the repose of his soul on Wednesday, January 22, at 8:00 AM.
