FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

Introit: *Psalm 96: 7, 8.* Adore God, all you His angels: Sion heard, and was glad; and the daughters of Juda rejoiced. *Ps. 96: 1.* The Lord hath reigned; let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. Glory be. Adore God.

Collect: Keep Thy family, we beseech Thee, O Lord, with Thy continual mercy that, leaning only upon the hope of Thy heavenly grace, it may ever be defended by Thy protection. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Colossians 3: 12-17.* Brethren, put ye on, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, the bowels of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty, patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if any have a complaint against another, even as the Lord hath forgiven you, so you also. But above all these things, have charity, which is the bond of perfection: and let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts, wherein also you are called in one body: and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly, in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another, in psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing in grace in your hearts to God. All whatsoever you do in word or in work, all things do ye in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God and the Father through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gradual: *Psalm 101: 16, 17.* The Gentiles shall fear thy name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. *V.* For the Lord hath built up Sion, and He shall be seen in His Majesty. Alleluia, Alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 96: 1.* The Lord hath reigned, let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 13: 24-30.* At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to the multitudes: The kingdom of heaven is likened to a man that sowed good seed in his field. But while men were asleep, his enemy came, and oversowed cockle among the wheat, and went his way. And when the blade was sprung up, and had brought forth fruit, then appeared also the cockle. And the servants of the good man of the house coming, said to him, Sir, didst thou not sow good seed in thy field? Whence then hath it cockle? And he said to them, An enemy hath done this. And the servants said to him, Wilt thou that we go and gather it up? And he said, No: lest perhaps gathering up the cockle you root up the wheat also together with it. Suffer both to grow until the harvest; and in the time of the harvest, I will say to the reapers, Gather up first the cockle, and bind it into bundles to burn, but the wheat gather ye into my barn.

Offertory: *Psalm 117: 16, 17.* The right hand of the Lord hath wrought strength, the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me: I shall not die, but live, and shall declare the works of the Lord.

Secret: We offer Thee, O Lord, the sacrifice of reconciliation, that Thou mayest mercifully forgive our sins and direct our wavering hearts. Through our Lord.

Communion: *St. Luke 4: 22.* They all wondered at these things, which proceeded from the mouth of God.

Postcommunion: We pray Thee, O almighty God, that we may receive the effect of that salvation of which we have received the pledge in these mysteries. Through our Lord.

**FIVE MASSES IN HONOR OF THE FIVE WOUNDS
OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST**

Monday, February 17 – Friday, February 21

There is a very ancient devotion (6th century) which consists in attending five Masses in honor of the Five Wounds of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Mass is the Votive Mass *Humiliavit* of the Passion (with the exception of the orations, which are proper).

Many temporal and spiritual graces are promised to those who accomplish this devotion, especially the grace to be preserved from the fires of Hell, as long as they persevere in good.

FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

Sunday, March 2 – Tuesday, March 4

The devotion of the Forty Hours has a long and venerable history in the Church. Although it can be observed at different times of the year, it originally spread throughout Christian Europe as an act of reparation for the sins committed during *Carnavale*, the days of riotous celebration before Ash Wednesday.

This year St. Mary's Oratory will offer the Forty Hours devotion from
Sunday, March 2 through Tuesday, March 4.

It will serve as a wonderful preparation for the season of Lent.

The Sunday Mass will be followed by Eucharistic procession, and the Blessed Sacrament will remain exposed until the closing Mass on Tuesday evening.

During the perpetual adoration, Mass and the Divine Office will be celebrated before the Blessed Sacrament exposed, in accordance with the rubrics.
