NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: Ps. 53, 6, 7. Behold, God is my helper, and the Lord is the protector of my soul: turn back the evils upon my enemies, and cut them off in Thy truth, O Lord, my protector. **Ps. 53, 3.** Save me, O God, by Thy name, and deliver me in Thy strength. *∇*. Glory.

Collect: Let the ears of Thy mercy, O Lord, be open to the prayers of Thy suppliants, and, that Thou mayest grant their desires to them that seek, make them to ask only for those things that please Thee. Through our Lord.

Epistle: 1 Cor. 10, 6-13. Brethren, let us not covet evil things, as they also coveted. Neither become ye idolaters, as some of them: as it is written: The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed fornication, and there fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them tempted, and perished by the serpents. Neither do you murmur, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now all these things happened to them in figure, and they are written for our correction, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore he that thinketh himself to stand, let him take heed lest he fall. Let no temptation take hold on you, but such as is human: and God is faithful, Who will not suffer you to be tempted above that which you are able; but will make also with temptation issue, that you may be able to bear it.

Gradual: Ps. 8, 2. O Lord our Lord, how admirable is Thy name in the whole earth. *∇*. For Thy magnificence is elevated above the heavens. Alleluia, alleluia. *∇*. **Ps. 58, 2.** Deliver me from my enemies, O my God: and defend me from them that rise up against me. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 19, 4-47. At that time, when Jesus drew near to Jerusalem, seeing the city, He wept over it saying, If thou also hadst known, and that in this thy day, the things that are to thy peace: but now they are hidden from thy eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, and thy enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and straiten thee on every side, and beat thee flat to the ground, and thy children who are in thee; and they shall not leave in thee a stone upon a stone, because thou hast not known the time of thy visitation. And entering into the temple, He began to cast out them that sold therein, and they that bought, saying to them, It is written, My house is the house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves. And He was teaching daily in the temple.

Offertory: Ps. 18, 9, 10, 11, 12. The justices of the Lord are right, rejoicing hearts, and His judgments sweeter than honey and the honeycomb: for Thy servant keepeth them.

Secret: Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, worthily to frequent these mysteries, for as often as the commemoration of this victim is celebrated, the work of our redemption is performed. Through our Lord.

Communion: John 6, 57. He that eateth My flesh, and drinketh My blood, abideth in Me, and I in him; saith the Lord.

Postcommunion: Let the communion of Thy sacrament, we beseech Thee, O Lord, both cleanse us from sin and make us of one mind and one heart in Thy service. Through our Lord.

We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. During the summer, weather permitting, we meet at Oak Island Park after the 10:30 am High Mass. Please join us.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.

All people of good will are welcome in the Holy Catholic Church, the Church founded by Jesus Christ 2000 years ago which offers the splendor of truth to a world darkened by sin.

Proper Attire in Church

Now that the warm summer weather is here, we kindly remind you about the importance of coming to church decently attired.

Although it can be tempting to dress with comfort primarily in mind, out of respect for God's house and out of consideration for the dignity of the human person, it is important to dress with modesty and decorum.

Revealing or tight-fitting clothing does not meet the norms for Christian modesty, especially in church. Gentlemen are kindly asked not to wear shorts. No exposed backs or shoulders. Ladies and girls should wear skirts and dresses falling at least below the knee and are encouraged to have their heads covered, in keeping with apostolic tradition.

Tattoos, which are by no means encouraged, should always be covered.
