FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS

Introit: Philip. 2, 10, 11. In the name of Jesus let every knee bow of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth; and let every tongue confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father. **Ps. 8, 2.** O Lord, our Lord, how wonderful is Thy name in the whole earth! *V.* Glory.

Collect: O God, Who didst appoint Thine only-begotten Son to be the Saviour of the human race, and didst command that He be called Jesus, mercifully grant that we may enjoy in heaven the vision of Him Whose holy name we venerate on earth. Through the same.

Epistle: Acts 4, 8-12. In those days, Peter, filled with the Holy Ghost, said, Ye princes of the people and ancients, hear: If we this day are examined concerning the good deed done to the infirm man, by what means he hath been made whole, be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ of Nazareth, Whom ye crucified, Whom God hath raised from the dead, even by Him this man standeth here before you whole. This is the stone which was rejected by you the builders; which is become the head of the corner: neither is there salvation in any other. For there is no other name under heaven given to men, whereby we must be saved.

Gradual: Ps. 105, 47. Save us, O Lord, our God, and gather us from among the nations: that we may give thanks to Thy holy name, and may glory in Thy praise. *V.* **Is. 63, 16.** Thou, O Lord, art our Father and Redeemer, Thy name is from eternity. Alleluia, alleluia. **Ps. 144, 21.** My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord, and let all flesh bless His holy name. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 2, 21. At that time, after eight days were accomplished that the child should be circumcised, His name was called Jesus, which was called by the angel, before He was conceived in the womb.

Offertory: Ps. 85, 12, 5. I will praise Thee, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify Thy name forever; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild, and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee. Alleluia.

Secret: May Thy blessing, O most merciful God, by which the whole creation hath life, sanctify this our sacrifice, which we offer Thee to the glory of the name of Thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, that it may be pleasing to Thy majesty as an act of praise and be profitable to us for our salvation. Through the same.

Communion: Ps. 85, 9, 10. All the nations Thou hast made shall come and adore before Thee, O Lord; and they shall glorify Thy name: for Thou art great, and dost wonderful things. Thou art God alone. Alleluia.

Postcommunion: Almighty, eternal God, Who hast created and redeemed us, graciously regard our desires, and deign to receive with kind and peaceful countenance the sacrifice of the saving victim, which we have offered to Thy majesty, in honor of the name of Thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, that, Thy grace being poured out upon us, we may rejoice in the glorious name of Jesus, the title of eternal predestination, because our names are written in heaven. Through the same.

We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. Please join us after the High Mass for coffee and doughnuts in the church hall downstairs.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite, called sometimes today the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. There are booklets in the pews to aid you in following the Mass. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, don't hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

Out of respect for God, make sure you turn off your phone and other devices while in Church. Thanks.

**Great Blessing of Epiphany Water
Sunday, January 5, at 5 PM**

This Solemn blessing comes from the Orient, where the Church has long emphasized in her celebration of Epiphany the mystery of our Lord's baptism. This aspect is not neglected in western Christendom, although in practice we have concentrated on the visit of the Magi.

The text used for the blessing is very old, having its origin most likely with Saints Cyril and Methodius (9th Century).

After the Blessing, the Epiphany Water will be available in the Holy Water dispenser in Scholz Hall.

SOLEMN PUBLICATION OF THE DATE OF EASTER AND OTHER MOVEABLE FEASTS

Epiphany is the last principal feast before the beginning of the Easter cycle. On this day, after the Gospel on the most important Mass of the day, there is the Solemn Publication of the Date of Easter and other main moveable feasts.

This chant is called by its first word "Noveritis", and its melody uses the same tune as the "Exultet" of the Easter Vigil, which gives a foretaste of the Easter joy to this publication.

Dom Prosper Guéranger explains:

"This custom, which dates from the earliest ages of the Church, shows both the mysterious connection which unites the great Solemnities of the year one with another, and the importance the Faithful ought to attach to the celebration of that which is the greatest of all, and the center of all Religion. After having honored the King of the universe on the Epiphany, we shall have to celebrate him on the day which is now announced to us, as the conqueror of death."

Translation of the "Noveritis" for the Year of Grace 2025:

"Know, dearest brethren, by the gift of God's mercy,
as we have rejoiced for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ,
so also we announce to you joy for the Resurrection of the same Our Savior.

On the sixteenth day of February will be Septuagesima Sunday.

On the fifth of March, the day of Ashes, and the beginning
of the fast of most holy Lent.

On the twentieth April, we will celebrate with joy
the holy Easter of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-ninth of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

On the eighth of June, the feast of Pentecost.

On the nineteenth of the same month, the feast of the
most holy Body of Christ.

On the thirtieth of November, the first Sunday of the Advent
of Our Lord, Jesus Christ,

to whom belong honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."
