SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

Introit: Let us all rejoice in the Lord, keeping a feast-day in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose celebration the angels rejoice and unite in praising the Son of God. **Ps. 44, 2.** My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. *V.* Glory.

Collect: O God, Whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection hath purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating on the mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same.

Commemoration of the Sunday: Being appeased, O Lord, grant to Thy faithful in abundance, we beseech Thee, both forgiveness and peace, that they may both be cleansed from all offenses and with a quiet mind give themselves to Thy service. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Prov. 8, 22, 24, 32, 35. The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now, therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

Gradual: Ps. 44, 5, 11, 12. Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. *V.* Hear, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear; for the King hath desired thy beauty. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* The solemnity of the glorious Virgin Mary, of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Juda, of the noble line of David. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 1, 26-38. At that time: the angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women. Who having heard, was troubled at his saying, and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her, Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son; and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father; and He shall reign in the house of Jacob forever. And of His kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel, How shall this be done, because I know not man? And the angel answering said to her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age; and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

Offertory: Ecclus. 24, 25, 39, 17. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have borne fruit.

Secret: Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be fittingly prepared for the offering of these gifts, and, through the mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to meditate upon the life, passion, and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may become worthy of His promises. Who with Thee.

Commemoration of the Sunday: Let these mysteries, we beseech Thee, O Lord, be our heavenly medicine and purge the evil from our hearts. Through our Lord.

Communion: Ecclus. 39, 19. Send forth flowers, as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.

Postcommunion: May we be assisted, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers of Thy most holy Mother, whose Rosary we celebrate, that the virtue of the mysteries we adore may be shared and the effect of the sacraments we have received may be obtained. Who livest.

Commemoration of the Sunday: That we may be rendered worthy of Thy sacred gifts, O Lord, grant us, we beseech Thee, ever to obey Thy commandments. Through our Lord.

ADDITIONAL SEATING IN THOMAS HALL DURING MASS

Dear Faithful,

We are grateful to Almighty God for the continued growth of our congregation here at St. Mary's. It has become clear that we have need of overflow seating on certain occasions of the year when the vast majority of our congregation is present at the same time (e.g., Midnight Mass, Good Friday). For that reason, we have now installed a video system in Thomas Hall which will allow people to see and hear the Mass and the sermon from that location. This high quality system will also prove very useful for conferences, classes and other presentations down the in hall.

Since this system is now available for use, we have decided to make it available to you on every Sunday and Holy Day throughout the year as well. We hope that families with small children will find it particularly helpful. Although you are still welcome to make use of the baptistery or the vestibule when you have a crying child, you may find that it is easier to avail yourself of this new option thanks to its greater space and proximity to the restrooms.

Please note that all persons are expected to exhibit the same conduct in the hall during Mass as they would upstairs in the nave: **modest dress, no conversation, and no use of electronic devices.**

We welcome any questions or suggestions you may have as we work to implement this new system and serve our growing flock.
