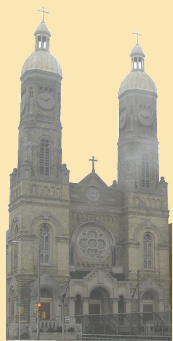

MASS VESTMENTS

At the time of the early Church, the same items of apparel worn now at the altar by the priest were part of ordinary clothing. Over the centuries, fashions changed but the vestments did not. This is symbolic of the continuity of the Church.

The third item which the priest puts on is the maniple. It is an ornamental vestment which is worn over the left forearm. It is typically made of damask or silk. Originally, this was a handkerchief which was carried in the left hand or thrown over the left arm.

The maniple is a symbol of the labor which the priest expects in his apostolate.

St. Cyril

Wednesday, July 7th, is the feast day of SS Cyril and Methodius. St. Cyril is represented in our church by a medallion. It is the 2nd medallion from the front, on the Epistle side.

St. Cyril died in Rome in the year 869, probably before he was consecrated a bishop. He and his brother, St. Methodius, were from Thessalonica and preached in Moravia, which is now part of the Czech Republic.

St. Methodius

St. Methodius shares Wednesday, July 7th, with his brother, St. Cyril. St. Methodius is also represented in our church by a medallion. It is the front medallion on the Epistle side.

St. Methodius was a bishop in Moravia and preached in Slavonic, which is an ancient language and the base language for much of eastern Europe. He died in 884. Cyril and Methodius are credited with pulling the eastern and western churches together.
