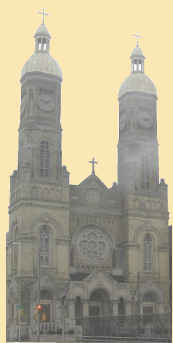
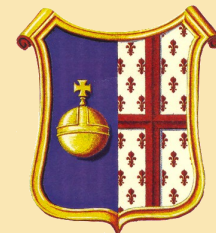

St. Peter in Chains

Today, August 1st, is the feast day of St. Peter in Chains. He is represented in our church in the medallion above the sanctuary, on the left. The feast of St. Peter in Chains honors the fact that St. Peter was imprisoned both in Jerusalem and in Rome. His chains from both imprisonments are enclosed in a large reliquary in Rome in the church of San Pietro in Vincoli. In the 5th Century, when Pope Leo I placed the chains in this reliquary, they were miraculously joined together.

Portiuncula Indulgence

This Monday, August 2nd, is the annual occurrence of the Portiuncula Indulgence, or the Pardon of Assisi. The name comes from the little chapel which was restored by St. Francis in 1209. Our Lord appeared to St. Francis in that chapel in 1216 and told him to ask the Pope to grant a plenary indulgence for those who visit that chapel. This was granted by Pope Honorius III. Over the years, the Portiuncula Indulgence has been expanded to apply to anyone saying certain required prayers in any church, under the usual conditions. The required prayers are six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys and six Glorias for the Pope's intentions.
