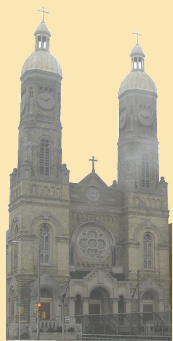
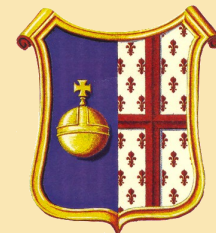

Litany of the Month ~ September

The only item which appears in both of our pamphlet racks is the Litany of the Month. The subject is associated with the current part of the Liturgical Year. For instance, for September, the Litany is of the Sorrowful Mother, whose feast day is September 15th.

Please take home a copy and make it part of your daily prayer time. Reciting it out loud in a family setting each day can increase the family's Catholicity. As with all the other items in the pamphlet racks, there is no charge for the litany copies. All items are provided by the Holy Name Society.

Our Lady Star of the Sea

Monday, September 27th, is the feast day of Our Lady Star of the Sea. She is also known as Stella Maris. In our church, this image of the Blessed Virgin Mary is painted on the ceiling, embossed in gold leaf. It is the painting on the epistle side, near the choir loft.

Our Lady Star of the Sea is represented under this title as the guide star on the way to Christ. She also comforted and protected the Kaszube fishermen, both in Milwaukee and in their native Poland.

The Kaszubes were important to the foundation of St. Stanislaus parish.

St. Wenceslaus

This Tuesday, September 28th, is the feast day of St. Wenceslaus. He is represented in our church by a medallion. It is the medallion on the wall behind the choir, on the epistle side.

St. Wenceslaus was Duke of Bohemia from the year 921 until his assassination in 935. He was a very holy and generous man. At night he went out, barefoot, without being recognized, and gave alms to widows, orphans and others in need. The Christmas carol "Good King Wenceslaus" is based upon these episodes in his life.
