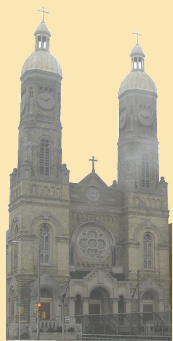
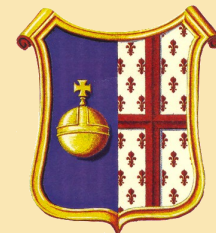

### **Litany of the Month- October**

October is closely associated with Our Lady of the Rosary and Our Lady of Fatima. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th and honors the famous battle of Lepanto. The rosary is a crown of roses. In the middle ages, some monks could not read. Instead of reciting the 150 psalms, as the other monks did, they said 150 Our Fathers. In the 11th century, this changed to 150 Hail Marys and was known as Our Lady's Psalter. St. Dominic received the rosary in its present form directly from the Blessed Virgin Mary in the year 1214. Then, in 1569 Pope St. Pius V set the fifteen mysteries. The litany for this month is Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady asked for the recitation of the rosary in each of the six Fatima apparitions, culminating with the miracle of the Sun on October 13, 1917. Please take copies of the litany from the pamphlet rack and recite it as a family.

### **St. Therese of the Child Jesus**

Today, October 3rd, is the feast day of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, also known as the Little Flower or Therese of Lisieux. She is represented in our church in a stained glass window, 1st from the front, on the Gospel side.

St. Therese was born in France in 1873 and died there in 1897. She became a Carmelite nun and developed a very simplistic way of serving God, known as The Little Way. After her death, many people read about her and followed her lead to holiness. Although she never went on a mission, St. Therese is the patron of missions. She is also the Institute's secondary patroness.

### **Our Lady of Good Help**

This Saturday, October 9th, is the anniversary of the major apparition of Our Lady of Good Help. She is pictured in the first stained glass window from the front of our church on the Epistle side, along with Adele Brise, to whom she appeared. There were three apparitions of Our Lady to Adele in 1859, at the present site of the shrine in Campion, Wisconsin. It is the first and only approved Marian apparition site in the United States.

A chapel was built there in 1859 and it served as a miraculous haven for people fleeing from the Pestigo fire of 1871. That fire burned 1,200,000 acres and claimed 2,000 lives.
