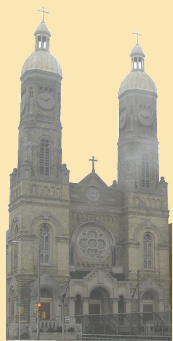

### Litany of the Month- October

October is closely associated with Our Lady of the Rosary and Our Lady of Fatima. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th and honors the famous battle of Lepanto. The rosary is a crown of roses. In the middle ages, some monks could not read. Instead of reciting the 150 psalms, as the other monks did, they said 150 Our Fathers. In the 11th century, this changed to 150 Hail Marys and was known as Our Lady's Psalter. St. Dominic received the rosary in its present form directly from the Blessed Virgin Mary in the year 1214. Then, in 1569 Pope St. Pius V set the fifteen mysteries.

The litany for this month is Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady asked for the recitation of the rosary in each of the six Fatima apparitions, culminating with the miracle of the Sun on October 13, 1917. Please take copies of the litany from the pamphlet rack and recite it as a family.

### St. Hedwig of Silesia

This Saturday, October 16th, is the feast day of St. Hedwig of Silesia. She is represented in our church by a medallion, the 3rd from the front on the Gospel side. St. Hedwig was born in Bavaria and at age 12 married Henry the Bearded, Duke of Silesia. Silesia was a historic region in Europe, mostly in present day Poland. She and the Duke had 7 children. After her husband's death, St. Hedwig took the grey habit of the Cistercians, but was not received into the order as a religious. She died in 1243 and was canonized in 1267. This St. Hedwig is sometimes confused with St. Hedwig of Poland, but that St. Hedwig was not canonized until 1997.
