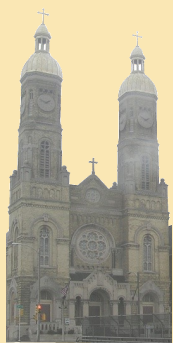
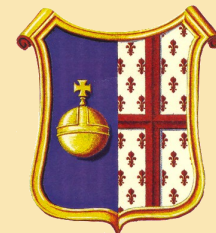

Mass will be in the Holy Hill Basilica, then outdoor Benediction, followed by picnic. Periodic updates will be made leading up to the event.

Saint John

This Monday, December 27th, is the feast of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist. He is represented in our church by his statue on the beam over the sanctuary. He was the only apostle at the foot of the cross and was asked by Our Lord to look after Our Lady. St. John is also represented on the beam by one of the four symbols from the Apocalypse. His symbol, on the left, is the Eagle as his writings flew like one. He also was the founder of the seven churches in the Apocalypse.

LAMB OF GOD

Above our high altar and above the bas relief of St. Stanislaus is another bas relief. It is of two angels incensing the Lamb of God. The Pascal Lamb was an important part of the Jewish religion. The annual sacrifice of a one year old lamb was planned all year long and was consummated by the ritual eating of a lamb by each family at their Passover meal. Jesus was born in Bethlehem at the same time as the lambs for Passover.

Jesus, innocent as a lamb, was sacrificed once and for all on Calvary. We receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Because of this, there is no longer any need for bloody sacrifice. The angels are giving honor and glory to Jesus by their incense.

DECEMBER LITANY

The litany for December is that of The Infant Jesus. It is a wonderful litany including many familiar titles and attributes of Our Lord. By itself, it makes up a beautiful meditation.

There are many copies of this litany in the pamphlet racks. It is the only item which always appears in both the north and the south vestibule. You are encouraged to take multiple copies and read them out loud, especially in a family setting.
