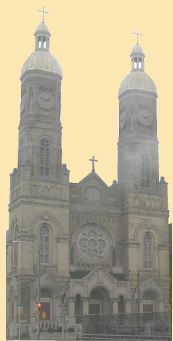

SUSPENSION OF THE ALLELUIA

Alleluia is a mystical Hebrew expression used in the liturgy to give glory and to praise God. It is the most common expression attributed to angels, as at the birth of Jesus.

Starting this Sunday, which is called Septuagesima, the Alleluia is not said as part of the Mass prayers. This suspension is in order to give us a sense of unworthiness. Alleluia is part of the language of heaven and we are reminded that we are not there yet.

The Alleluia will be brought back at Easter when we will all rejoice at the Resurrection of Our Lord.

St. Bernadette

Friday, February 18th, is the feast day of St. Bernadette Soubirous, the young girl to whom the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in 1858 at Lourdes, France. She is included in the 3rd stained glass window from the front on the Epistle side, along with Our Lady of Lourdes.

Life was very hard for Bernadette after the apparitions, mainly because of the steady stream of visitors to her home. After two years she moved away and lived in the convent of the Nuns of Nevers. After eight years, she joined the motherhouse of that order and took the habit as Sister Marie Bernard. She died at age 36.

Saints Jacinta and Francisco Marto

Next Sunday, February 20th, is the feast day of Jacinta and Francisco Marto. They were only 7 and 9 years old at the time the Blessed Virgin Mary first appeared to them and Lucia at Fatima in 1917. The year before, the Angel of Portugal visited them. They are depicted in the stained glass window in our church, 2nd from the front on the Epistle side.

Francisco died at age 11 and Jacinta died after him, just short of 10 years old. February 20th was set as their feast day, as Jacinta died on that date, in 1920. When her body was exhumed in 1935, it was found to be whole and incorrupt.
