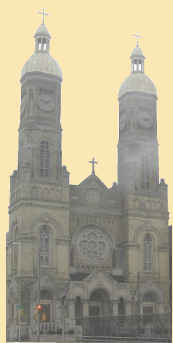
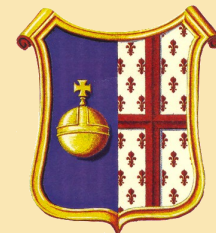

FROM THE RECTORS'S DESK

ENCOURAGEMENT TO SING AT MASS!

Is it allowed to sing at Mass?

Yes! At a Low Mass the faithful are invited to sing the Marian antiphon at the end of the Mass or the hymn for the recessional. At a High Mass, the faithful are invited to sing the Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei which make up the Ordinary of the Mass. The congregation is also invited to sing *Et cum spiritu tuo*, *Amen*, the dialogue before the Preface, and the final *Deo Gratias* at the end of Mass. At all Masses, those who are about to receive Holy Communion are invited to say the *Domine, non sum dignus* after the priest says *Ecce, Agnus Dei*. After a Low Mass, the congregation is invited to pray the prayers ordered by Leo XIII.

LITANY OF THE MONTH – MARCH

March includes the feast day of St. Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus. He is the patron saint of workers and of fathers. Pope Pius IX declared him to be both the patron and the protector of the Catholic Church, in addition to his patronages of the sick and of a happy death, because he died in the presence of Jesus and Mary.

This litany is a simple one and would be a good introduction to reciting a daily litany in our households. St. Joseph is a model to all fathers. He is our spiritual father and provides for our well being.

ST. BENEDICT

This Monday, March 21st, is the feast day of St. Benedict. He is represented in our church by a stained glass window, the 2nd from the front on the Gospel side. St. Benedict is a patron of the Institute.

St. Benedict is pictured with a broken goblet because some lax monks tried to poison him and the goblet broke when he made the sign of the cross over it. He ultimately founded twelve monasteries to accommodate all the monks who wished to be under his rule. He lived his final years at Monte Cassino, where he died in 547. He is the patron saint of Europe.

The Annunciation

This Friday, March 25th, we celebrate The Annunciation. In our church, this is represented in the Rose Window over the choir loft. It is the image on the left side.

The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the celebration of Archangel Gabriel's visit to Mary in which he asked for her fiat, her consent, to be the mother of Jesus. The celebration is nine months before Christmas.
