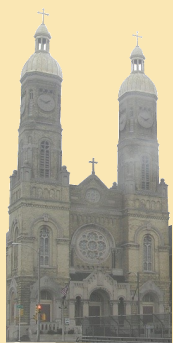

MAY LITANY

The litany for May is that of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is also known as the Litany of Loreto.

We honor Mary as the mother of Our Lord and as the mother of the Church. May has been the month to honor mothers going all the way back to the ancient Greeks who dedicated the month of May to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity. The Romans had a goddess called Flora, which is related to the flowers of Spring.

This litany recalls all the various titles of Mary, many of which are familiar to us all. This is a good litany to recite out loud, perhaps as a family, each day during this month of Mary.

St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr

Saturday, May 7th, is the feast day of St. Stanislaus of Cracow, Bishop and Martyr. He lived in the 11th century, in Poland. Our church is dedicated to him and he is represented in our church in a variety of places.

Inside, the statue of St. Stanislaus watches over us as we go in and out the parking lot entrance. His relic is at his feet. He is also featured in the stained glass window on the epistle side of the sanctuary.

In addition, the bas relief over the main altar depicts St. Stanislaus presenting a man who he had raised from the dead, in order to testify in a court case. There is also a 2nd statue of St. Stanislaus outside, along the south side of our church.
