### *Thought from St. Francis de Sales*

After the soul of the Blessed Virgin had left its most pure body, her body was laid in the tomb and restored to the earth. The same thing happened to the body of her Son. It was reasonable and just that the Mother should not enjoy more privileges than the Son, but as Our Lord rose after three days, so she was restored to life, but in a different manner. The Savior rose by His own power, the Virgin Mary rose by the power of her Son, Who commanded her soul to be reunited with her body. It was right that her most holy body should not be subject to corruption. From that body Our Lord Jesus Christ has taken His bodily existence, remaining in her most chaste womb for the space of nine months.

## Assumption of Our Lady

**INTROIT:** *Apocalypse 12: 1* A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. *Ps. 97: 1* Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle: because He hath done wonderful things. Glory be... A great sign...

**COLLECT:** Almighty and everlasting God, who hast taken up the Immaculate Virgin Mary, the Mother of Thy Son, with body and soul into heavenly glory: grant, we beseech Thee, that we may always, intent on higher things, deserve to be partakers of her glory. Through the same our Lord...

**EPISTLE:** *Judith 13: 22-25; 15: 10* The Lord hath blessed thee by his power, because by thee he hath brought our enemies to naught. Blessed art thou O daughter, by the Lord the most high God, above all women upon the earth. Blessed be the Lord who made heaven and earth who hath directed thee to the cutting off the head of the prince of our enemies because he hath so magnified thy name this day, that thy praise shall not depart out of the mouth of men who shall be mindful of the power of the Lord forever; for that thou hast not spared thy life, by reason of the distress and tribulation of thy people, but hast prevented our ruin in the presence of our God. Thou art the glory of Jerusalem thou art the joy of Israel, thou art the honor of our people.

**GRADUAL:** *Ps. 44: 11-12 & 14* Hearken, O daughter, and see, and incline thy ear: and the King shall greatly desire thy beauty. *V.* The daughter of the King comes in, all beautiful: her robes are of golden cloth.

**ALLELUIA:** Alleluia, alleluia. Mary has been taken up into heaven: the choirs of angels rejoice. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** *Lk. 1: 41-50* At that time: Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and cried out with a loud voice saying: Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb! And how have I deserved that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, the

moment that the sound of thy greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who has believed, because the things promised her by the Lord shall be accomplished. And Mary said: My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my saviour; because he has regarded the lowliness of his handmaid; for, behold, henceforth all generations shall call me blessed; because he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name; and his mercy is from generation unto generation on those who fear him.

**OFFERTORY:** *Genesis 3: 15* I will put enmities between thee and the Woman, and between thy seed and her Seed.

**SECRET:** May the offering of our devotion ascend to Thee, O Lord; and through the intercession of the most blessed Virgin Mary, who was taken up into heaven, may our hearts be inflamed with the fire of love, and continually long for Thee. Through our Lord...

**PREFACE:** It is truly meet and just, right and availing unto salvation, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty and everlasting God; and magnify Thee with due praise, bless and proclaim Thee in the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary; we should praise, bless and proclaim Thee. For she conceived Thine only-begotten Son by the overshadowing of the Holy Ghost, and losing not the glory of her virginity, gave forth to the world the everlasting Light, Jesus Christ our Lord, Through whom the angels praise Thy majesty, the dominions worship it, and the powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the heavenly hosts with the blessed seraphim join together in celebrating their joy. With these we pray Thee join our voices also, while we say with lowly praise: Holy, Holy, Holy...
